

HOLLY REESE Graduate of the Year **Award Winner**

ELIJAH LEE Edgar J. Helms Outstanding Achiever Award Winner

Elijah Lee was introduced to Goodwill through our summer youth employment program. He excelled in the program, learning new skills and acclimating to a work environment.

But when it came time for Elijah to graduate, he wasn't sure what was next.

Our staff worked with him to see what he was interested in and what skills he had to offer. From there, they helped him develop a plan to gain employment.

Elijah knew he loved working with electronics and wanted to be with a company where he was valued and accepted. Together, he found a job where he loves going to work and has been able to make meaningful connections with coworkers.



JESSICA COTTRILL Achiever of the Year Award Winner

Jessica Cottrill went through our parenting skills program. When she was introduced to Goodwill for help, she was apprehensive at first and didn't want to do the work.

A lot was riding on this, and she knew she wouldn't be able to keep custody of her daughter if she didn't put in the effort.

Together, we were able to help Jessica have a shift in her mindset. She put in the hard work and truly wanted to learn how to be a better parent for the sake of her daughter.

Jessica proved to herself that she could do it! She learned so much and as a result. she was able to keep custody of her daughter, and now her family is thriving.

These vital programs change people's lives. Just last year, we were able to serve 22,056 people through our mission programs.

People like Gavin, who has Autism and was homebound for more than a decade and came to Goodwill for help building his skillset to find a job.

People like Latasia, who wanted to provide a better life for herself and her daughter. Goodwill was able to work with her, build her confidence and find a job that allowed her to make a better wage and be closer to her daughter's daycare.

People like Betty, who has worked with Goodwill twice to find a job—once prior to the onset of COVID-19 and again when the pandemic shuttered her place of work. She was suffering some personal loss as well, and Goodwill worked to develop her job skills and place her in a role in which she excels.

These are just a few examples of how your donations change lives. Just know that the impact is huge, and we thank you for being a part of it.

DID YOU KNOW OUR BOOKSTORES ACCEPT DONATIONS?

Just because our bookstores are stocked with lots of books, DVDs, CDs and other media doesn't mean that's all we accept in the form of donations.

Our bookstores accept donations of all kinds. You can donate clothing, books and other media, toys, household items, computers, cellphones and other electronics, kitchen items, and all other items you would donate at our retails except for large furniture.

There are only a few items we cannot accept at our bookstores and retail stores. Those include tube TVs and monitors, mattresses and sleeper sofas, drop-side cribs, hazardous materials and fuel, large appliances and pianos and organs.

Donating is easy at each bookstore. Our Westlake store has a donor door to the left of the entrance, where you can drive up with your donations. At our North Canton store, there is a walk-up door for donations and designated donor parking spots. An attendant will come out to help if you park in a designated parking spot.

Our bookstores are open from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Saturday and 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. Sunday. 30655 Detroit Rd., Westlake and 2207 E. Maple St., North Canton.
