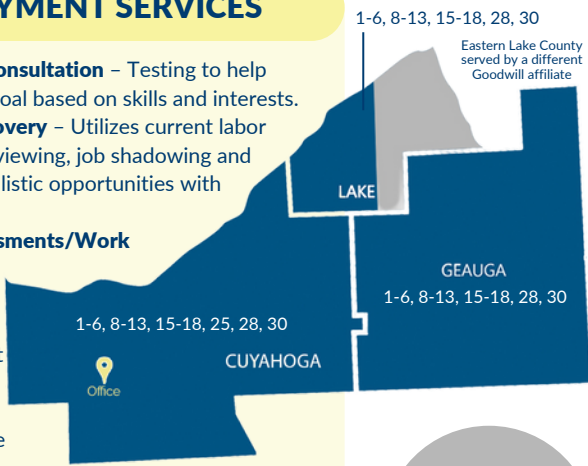

PRE-EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

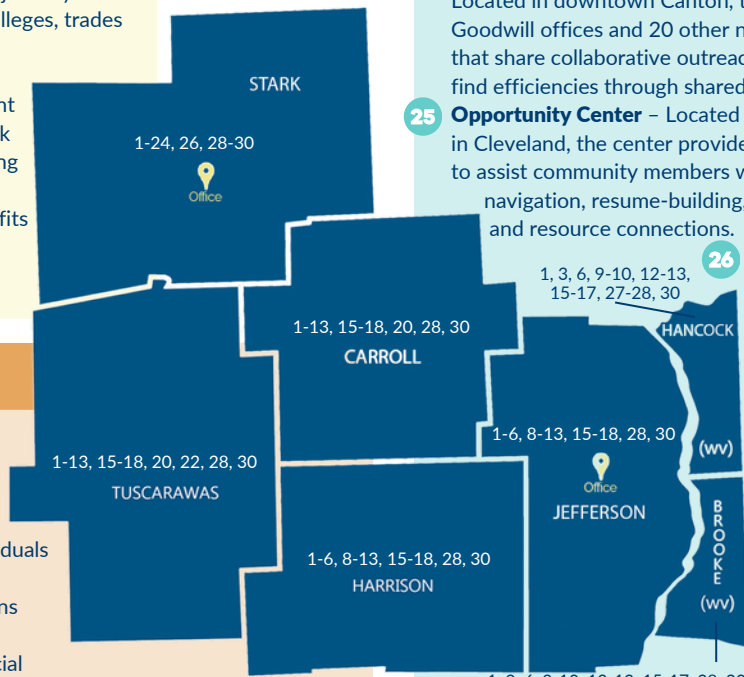
- 1 Vocational Evaluation/Consultation** – Testing to help determine a feasible job goal based on skills and interests.
- 2 Career Exploration/Discovery** – Utilizes current labor market information, interviewing, job shadowing and on-site visits to match realistic opportunities with personal interests.
- 3 Community Based Assessments/Work Adjustments** – Provides opportunities to assess, build and enhance work skills at worksites throughout the community aimed at enhancing the potential to maintain employment in the community.
- 4 Digital Skills Training** – Teaches basic online and computer skills including general use, typing, and Microsoft Office.
- 5 IT Certification** – Individualized training providing program participants with industry recognized credentials for the IT industry.
- 6 Youth Transition Services** – Provides school-aged youth with the skills necessary to transition on their journey after high school through exploration of careers, colleges, trades and more.
- 7 Comprehensive Case Management and Employment Program (CCMEP)** – Employment skills training, life skills, parenting classes, work experience, and wrap around support for young adults in partnership with Ohio Means Jobs.
- 8 Work Incentive Plan** – Explores current benefits and analyzes data to explain the impact on a participant's earning potential.

FAMILY STRENGTHENING

- 16 Emergency Voucher Program** – Provides pre-loaded cards used to secure clothing and household items for those in emergent situations.
- 17 Social Services** – Provides assistance to individuals in navigation and connection to community resources through outreach at various locations within the community.
- 18 Financial Literacy** – Offers participants financial education on topics related to personal finances and budgeting.
- 19 Adult Literacy Services** – Assists adults in overcoming reading and math obstacles.
- 20 Compass** – Sexual Assault, Prevention and Support Services for women, children, and men who are survivors of rape or sexual abuse.
- 21 Parenting Skills Training Program** – Classroom based program that educates parents who are at risk or who have had children placed in foster or alternative care.
- 22 Home-Based Parenting Program** – Provides education and real-life application with support in the parent's own home.
- 23 Parents Anonymous** – Weekly support group for parents and/or caregivers that encourages mutual support and safe, strong families.



JOB-PLACEMENT SERVICES

- 9 Job Seeking Skills Training** – Assists participants in resume creation and how to successfully identify and respond to potential job opportunities.
- 10 Job Development** – Assists in the full scope of employment related needs, from job seeking skills training through job search and employment retention. This program is tailored to the needs of each individual participant and factors in any barriers to employment.
- 11 Job Coaching Services/Individual Employment Support** – Provides on the job coaching to enhance and grow job skills and appropriate work behaviors to assist with job retention.
- 12 Job Fairs** – Goodwill hosts job fairs with area employers looking to hire.
- 13 Hiring Events** – Goodwill hosts and partners to provide on-the-spot interviews for program participants and our partner organizations.
- 14 Huntington Community Employment Room** – Employment Specialists are available to provide assistance for job seekers in the community to build a resume, complete applications, and utilize technology to assist with gaining employment.
- 15 Employment G.P.S.** – Individualized, long-term, intensive case management program focused on helping achieve goals of employment and education.

OUTREACH

- 24 The Ken Weber Community Campus at Goodwill** – Located in downtown Canton, the Campus is home to Goodwill offices and 20 other non-profit organizations that share collaborative outreach to the community and find efficiencies through shared space and services.
- 25 Opportunity Center** – Located at 1333 East 179th Street in Cleveland, the center provides employment specialists to assist community members with social service navigation, resume-building, job-seeking skills training, and resource connections.
- 26 Book Works*** – Children's literacy program that provides free books to families and children.
- 27 Table of Hope** – Hot meal site serving Weirton (WV) and Hancock County communities.
- 28 Coming Together for Good** – Diversity, equity and inclusion outreach and training for businesses and nonprofits as well as individuals.
- 29 Project Blueprint** – Project Blueprint is a leadership development program for emerging leaders in under-represented communities.
- 30 Good Partner** – Focused on improving workplace retention, productivity, advancement, financial stability, and the well-being of employees through partnerships with local businesses.
